Getting There and Getting Around

Edinburgh is served by a major international airport situated 8km to the West of the city. 33 airlines serve 188 routes so delegates from around the UK and the world should be able to fly in hassle free. Transport links from the airport include car hire, buses and coaches, trams and taxis. Subject to the time of day the average journey time can take approximately 25 mins. A regular airport bus is operated by Airlink 100 and runs every 10 minutes, 24 hours a day departing from Waverley Bridge. Waverley station and Haymarket station are Edinburgh's two major railway stations and operate regular services to other parts of Scotland and the UK on a frequent basis. Waverley station is located in city centre Edinburgh while Haymarket is located in the West End. Follow the link for national rail enquires <http://www.nationalrail.co.uk/>

An extensive road network links Edinburgh to the rest of Scotland and the UK making access to the capital easy by car. Travelling west, Edinburgh to Glasgow can take just over an hour along the M8 and traveling northwards, it will take approximately 2.5 hours to reach Aberdeen and 3.5 hours to arrive in Inverness. Newcastle is approximately a 2.5 hour drive and Manchester and Birmingham, 4 and 6 hours respectively.

Travel within the city is made easy via an extensive bus service and WiFi friendly trams. Wheel chair accessible ramps and lifts are provided at the stops along the route. Follow the links for details of both service:
